Her repertoire range from Baroque until contemporary Music. She performed many recitals with her father, the pianist Bruno Canino, and in Chamber Music with Antonio Ballista, Cristiano Rossi, Sylvie Gazeau, Paul Gulda, Gabriele Pieranunzi, Cristiano Rossi, Giuseppe Garbarino.

She is the second Violin of the Mantegna Quartet from 2002, with which she has undertaken a rich concert activity

for important musical associations in Italy and abroad, playing at the Quirinale, in the Euroradio concerts for the Lausanne Society of Contemporary Music in a program dedicated to Thomas Adès together with the pianist Bruno Canino, Festival Pontino, "MondoMusica" in Cremona, Festival "Trame Sonore" in Mantova.

She is really active on teaching and she gave, for several years, Masterclass in Violin, Orchestra and Chamber Music in Trentino "Festival Risonanze Armoniche", Domodossola "Associazione Orchestra". She also taught in the Istituto Pareggiato "Giacomo Puccini" in Gallarate and at the Fondazione "Claudio Abbado" in Milan. She is currently teaching in "Istituto Costa" in Vigevano.

Since 2013 she started to study Conducting with Yoichi Sugiyama in Milan.

She is playing a French Violin "Pierray" of 1701.
